President Report

As mentioned last month, the Annual General Meeting of the Millican Ogden Community Association is scheduled for Tuesday October 15. This will be the 63rd anniversary of the Association which is quite an achievement in itself. These AGM meetings are important and are a requirement of Provincial Legislation for not-for-profit organizations. These meetings are open to all residents but only those who hold a MOCA membership can vote. It is our opportunity to be accountable to the community, and more specifically to the membership, with a presentation of the Financial Statement for the year ending May 31, 2019 and a review of the happenings over the past year along with an outline of what lies ahead for the organization. Several of the current Board are up for re-election for another two year term and of course, it is an opportunity for new Directors to be added to the Board through the election process. Please put October 15 in your calendar. Your attendance and participation at this meeting is appreciated.

Succession planning is becoming more and more important with each passing year, which is why we would welcome some new faces to the Board. We are a very diverse organization operating the community hall, Jack Setters Arena, and being the governing body for the Southeast Calgary Resource Centre. While we are a volunteer organization, we are also a registered charity organization. We are an employer, a facility operator, and a social service agency, and of course we also represent the entire community of Millican, Ogden, Lynnwood to the City becoming involved to some degree in all development projects like the upcoming Greenline, and other new construction projects, long range planning documents like the Area Redevelopment Plan, and the many quality of life issues that arise from time to time in the community. There are a lot of moving parts but these are exciting times. We have a very rich and interesting past history, but we have every reason to be optimistic about the future. Change is happening, and the various pieces of change can sometimes be painful and slow, but it can be exciting to watch as change occurs and improvements made through new development. We need to add new faces to the Board to ensure that this organization continues to move forward as it has in the past. If anyone feels inclined to become involved, please contact us. The time commitment is only what you can give as obviously family and work carry a much higher priority.

I am sure you are all aware that Jack Setters Arena is back up and running again. It was a long and frustrating time during the shutdown period, but once things started to happen about the middle of July, when the contractor was selected and the materials were on site, the work then went real well. Our staff had a very short window to do their preparation for the upcoming year but the contractors were able to cooperate and coordinate their work and it all came together in the end. All of our customers/user groups have returned and committed to their ice times. Facility operating staff are now in place and we are looking forward to a very good year ahead.

As for our planned expansion of the Community Hall, we have found it necessary to again put the project on hold. For a variety of reasons, the project is not in a position to proceed and we have lost the construction season for this year. The money that we have been provided with from various grant programs to fund the project have expiry dates. Letters are being sent to each to explain the situation and request an extension.

There is nothing new on the construction of the berm to support the diversion track related to the 78th Avenue underpass. We will do our best to keep residents informed as new information becomes available.

I want to try to use this newsletter to highlight some of the programs and services offered at the Southeast Calgary Community Resource Centre [SECCRC] located at 2734 - 76th Avenue SE --- just east of Ogden Road on 76th Avenue. They offer parenting programs, health programs, and educational programs focused on providing families with the tools, the knowledge, and the information needed to preserve and enhance the well-being of their family unit. They offer English as a Second Language classes, support groups for those dealing with mental health issues, and tax clinics in the spring for those who require help in completing their taxes. Their Community Connections program connects clients with information and resources that can help their family be successful and healthy. Needs assessments are completed regularly and the staff are able to offer the resources and referrals they need to receive food, furniture, clothing and school supplies. Their Career and Employment program offers resume building, interviewing skills, computer classes, and various safety courses required for employment. Computers are made available for clients for their use. And then there is the Youth Program at Mo's Place located at the main community Hall. In the lower level of the Centre you will find a clothing and housewares bank operated totally by volunteers. Recognizing there are many other good organizations in the City, but all donations of clothing and small appliances are always welcome. Men's clothing is always in short supply and of course we are getting closer and closer to the colder months meaning a need for the warmer winter clothing. This is a very short summary of the good work provide by the great staff and volunteers at the Centre. Programs are funded by the United Way, Calgary and Area Child Family Services, and Family and Community Support Services [FCSS]. The Centre serves 47 communities in the southeast quadrant of the City, and literally thousands of clients each year qualify for and receive access the services provided. So much good work is done at the Centre and again, any help with donations of clothing and small appliances is appreciated.

Finally, I have to mention the upcoming Federal election. Monday, October 21 is the official election day, but advance polling will also be in place. I would encourage each of you to do your research and become familiar with candidates in our area and the Parties that they represent. All elections are important and I want to encourage you to make the effort to place your X beside the candidate of your choice.

And of course, if you are planning a social event, ie, for your family, or business, or organization, please give some thought to renting the MOCA Hall, - main hall upper floor, or the lower level room. We would appreciate your business.







Get your kids emergency ready in 20 minutes

In a city with a risk of tornado, flood, winter storms and so much more, empowering children with the knowledge of how to prepare and take action during an emergency or disaster is the best way to keep them safe. That's why The City of Calgary developed the Ready Squad, a fun and interactive 20 minute on-line course targeted to kids age 7-12.

"Children are often overlooked when it comes to disaster planning, but teaching them about emergencies and having them contribute to emergency action plans will increase their resilience to disaster and improve safety for the whole family, "says Tom Sampson, Chief of Calgary Emergency Management Agency.

The Ready Squad course teaches children important emergency preparedness skills and protective actions, in a fun way. Kids will learn: what the disaster risks in Calgary are, such as floods and tornadoes; ways to prepare, like creating a home evacuation plan and having household emergency supplies; what to do during common emergencies and how to stay informed; and understand what to expect when recovering from a disaster.

Children are more physically and emotionally vulnerable to disasters than adults. Research indicates that empowering them with knowledge and awareness in advance of a disaster will keep them safer and more resilient to trauma they may endure during an event. In addition, children are great messengers and will spread this important emergency preparedness information to their friends, family, and other members of their community.

There is no need to register or sign up for the course. Simply visit **calgary.ca/readysquad** and click on the link to take the free course and become a Ready Squad member.

Preparing your home and yard for winter: the Fall Checklist is a great place to start

Do you wonder every fall if you are doing the right things – indoors and outdoors – to prepare your home for winter? The Homeowner Water Guide Fall Checklist is a great place to start, with simple steps you can take to improve your water efficiency, protect your home from leaks and prepare your yard for winter. You'll find great reminders and tips like:


- Check your toilets, taps, humidifier, hot water heater, water softener and other water using devices for leaks
- Turn off your outdoor water supply and winterize your irrigation system to avoid winter leaks
- Check the Watering 101 Guides to find out when to stop watering plants, shrubs and trees
- Check the lawn care guide for tips on letting your grass grow into dormancy - when to stop watering and cutting

When it comes to residential and household leaks, toilets, faucets and outdoor irrigation are the most common culprits, although any water using device can leak. It also provides step-by-step procedures for both identifying and repairing leaks in our homes, and guidance on using water in the most efficient ways possible.

Halloween Trick-or-Treating Tips

IHalloween can be a fun and exciting event for kids (and adults)! Below are some informative tips to increase neighbourhood safety on October 31.

Residents:

- Turn on outdoor lights and replace burnt-out bulbs.
- Clear a path from the road to your front door and remove any potential obstacles or tripping hazards.
- Keep your pets safe. Keep pets indoors and away from the unfamiliar (and spooky) quests at the front door.
- Beware of potential food allergies; consider alternative goodies.
- If you're driving be cautious of Goblins, Ghouls and Ghosts out and about in your neighbourhood.

Parents:

- Costumes should be short enough to avoid tripping; and be light coloured in order to be easily seen at night. Having your child wear reflective tape will also help them be better seen by drivers.
- Use non-toxic makeup to complete costumes instead of masks as masks can reduce visibility for your child.
- Create an easy to follow route with your children and teenagers.
- Travel in groups of three or four. Young children should be accompanied by a responsible adult.
- Practice crosswalk safety. Make your way up one side of the street and cross to the other side looking both ways, don't criss-cross back and forth.
- Double-check you child's goodie bags to ensure everything is safe to eat
