President Report

President's Report – January 2022

Well, what a year we have experienced. As we bring 2021 to a close and welcome to 2022, I would be remiss if I didn't look back on the year that was. First off, I would like to thank the following departed directors for their service to the Community, Ray Jasper, Pieter Van Lindenberg and Matt Strangeman, without volunteers like you we would not be able to accomplish the things that we have over the years. For that, and from the bottom of my heart I thank you. COVID has stolen many of the headlines and much of our attention over the past two years, and frankly I don't expect much to change amongst rising case counts and rapidly morphing variants, it is clear this will be a long battle, so I ask you this, as we stumble through new, and often confusing restrictions and protocols, be kind to each other. We all have different belief systems, that's what makes us so interesting, and we are all capable of compassion, that's what makes us human.

As for an update on the hall expansion, as we have previously reported we have drawings suitable to obtain bids which we expect by the middle of January. Following that we will require both a board review and a Financial and Technical Review from the City of Calgary, the later will take approximately eight (8) weeks. This puts us issuing contracts in the late part of March or early April, otherwise just in time for the construction season. As we know that contract will exceed the board authority by a fair margin and will require a special general meeting, keep your eyes open for that notice early in the spring.

Now for Greenline. The Short answer is there is nothing to report, the City is continuing on pre-construction work which is largely focused in the Beltline, for obvious reason, that is where the majority of the time, and labour consuming will occur during construction. As for project in our community, nothing has been announced save for the recent demolition on Ogden Road. (not the Block Apartments, the house next door to the South) As far as we are aware the Province is still investigating any historical significance of the Block Apartments. Most recently I have received a query respecting an old tunnel beneath the CPR Mainline at the bottom of what many of us called Dairy Queen Hill, and more specifically will it be preserved, the short answer is I have no news on that, I know the tunnel, I explored it in my youth (as many of us who grew up around here did)What I do know is that it exists entirely on property owned by CP Rail. I have made enquiries, but I expect I won't have any answers until the new year, more to follow on that.

Things to be on the lookout for in the new year.

Hall expansion, we have recently seen a fair bit of movement such that we expect the 2022 construction season will be fruitful in bringing that project much closer to a conclusion.

Community Garden, we are awaiting a License of Occupation from the City but with all the appropriate agreements in principle we

the City but with all the appropriate agreements in principle we expect that early in the new year with construction occurring early in the spring. We do have a commitment from the City to install water as early as possible in the spring subject to ground thaw, likely in the May timeframe.


Greenline, we don't expect much in the way of Greenline, we do expect sometime in the future construction work for a diversion track while the 78th Avenue underpass goes in. This will lead to the eventual closure of the 69th Avenue level crossing. We also expect a slight relocation of a stretch of Ogden Road to make room for the new LRT line, for those of us softball enthusiasts expect that parking along Pop Davies Park on Ogden Road will disappear. And we expect a regrade of Millican Hill as part of Greenline. Now like I said earlier, and it is quite frustrating, there are no timelines for any of these projects, some of which are years overdue.

Public Art – As you may recall we had a public art project that was started but never did reach completion, the City has decided to rectify that and has commissioned a new project. Details are scarce but suffice it to say a new project will be forthcoming this year.

More to follow on that.

In closing, we have an exciting, and busy year ahead and I for one cannot wait to get on with it. Be kind to each other and keep your eyes open for all of the exciting new things to come.

Happy New Year! Our Alberta government recently inked a historic made-in-Alberta childcare agreement with Ottawa. Children's Services Minister Rebecca Schulz was unflinching in her pursuit of a deal that respects Alberta's diverse childcare system and parental choice. Funding will apply to both private and not-for-profit childcare services. This plan includes the majority of Alberta parents who choose to use private childcare facilities. In addition to private spaces, this plan will add over 42,000 new licensed, non-profit and day home childcare spaces over the next five years. It will also help create childcare spaces for parents who work shift work or overnights, so they too are supported.

Alberta's updated forecasts show that real gross domestic product is expected to grow by 6.1% this year, which is significantly higher than the 4.8% forecast released at the start of the year.

Job numbers are way up, with Statistics Canada's latest report showing that Alberta created 15,000 new jobs in November and has created 105,400 new jobs over the past 12 months. These jobs are in addition to the hundreds of thousands of jobs that were lost and restored since the start of the pandemic. Alberta now has the highest employment rate in the nation!

Various factors are supporting our strong economic comeback, including improved commodity prices, but our government's persistent focus on attracting new investment and improving competitiveness for our key sectors is making a major difference. Thanks to our policy efforts, our province is seeing billions of dollars in new investment and capital being deployed across the province right now. This is happening in hydrogen, tech, aerospace, petrochemicals, and many other areas.




