Congratulations to the following Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee Medal Recipients:







Snippets From a Senior - Part 3

This month, we have the continuation of an article written by Keith Moss, a grandson of George Moss, after whom George Moss Park is named. George and his wife, Edith, settled in Ogden in 1913 when he obtained a job as a machinist at the C.P.R. Ogden Shops. George was a member of St. Augustine's Church, was the secretary of the Ogden Community Association for 32 years, and was a Charter Member of the Ogden Legion. The park is named after him for his dedicated service to his community.

Just to the west of the rink the city built a fairly large wading pool. It was surrounded on the North and West sides by a green 6 foot high board fence. On the east side of the wading pool there was a wooden shelter with bench seats. The south side of the pool was open. It was of concrete construction and if memory serves me correctly it would have been about 30 feet square. It is where I learned to float and dog paddle. The middle of the pool where the drain was was about 18 inches deep. To the west of the wading pool and just across 76th avenue from the United Church was a small community hall. It was the hub for summer activities sponsored by the City and was also used for Community Meetings and Concerts. All of these structures had been built on what is now George Moss Park.

At the bottom of the South Hill was a large slough. In the winter the kids in the Community would gather there, clean off the ice, have someone bring in straw bales, build an open fire right on the ice and skate or play shinny until it was time to go home. When you skated on the slough you had to be wary of muskrat pop-ups and any bull rushes that had bent over and were just lying under the surface of the ice.

In the winter we also enjoyed skiing and tobogganing just west of Nagel's farm. This farm was located just next door to 18th street and 74th avenue. There were no inner tubes or crazy carpets at that time. We used wooden skis with leather harnesses, wooden toboggans, and sleighs with metal runners, we had fun using snow to build jumps at the base of the hill and then sailing over them in mid air. Ours was only one of many toboggans that received a broken board while involved in these aerial performances. Another hill that provided winter fun was at 72nd avenue and Ogden Road just across from the Men's Hostel. In the winter two city employees would pull about sixteen feet of six inch flexible rubber hose which they attached to each of the fire hydrants in the Community. There was a fire hydrant right at the top of 72nd and Ogden Road. They would flush the hydrant and let the water spill down a small hill that is there. With sleighs with metal runners or just cardboard we could go zooming down the ice covered hill almost to where the new legion is now.

The Bow River provided lots of entertainment, exercise, and solace for many Ogden residents. Before I was born the Beaver Dams was the community swimming hole. I can remember my Mom telling me about a woman who dove in the water at the Beaver Dams and surfaced minus her false teeth. The Ogden Community rallied behind her and dove until they found her chompers. In the late 40's and early 50's the Bow River was a haven for myself and my friends. There were no paved paths or bike trails along the floodplain and the steep banks as there are now. In the late 40's the area was covered in poplar, aspen' Saskatoon's, and lots of willow. For preteen boys this was an ideal environment for building tree huts and other shelters. Once into our teens and old enough to possess firearms, we spent many enjoyable hours hunting ducks, partridge, and pheasants, and fishing along the Bow River. This area was a refuge of solitude with very few others around.

Keith's reminiscences will be continued in the next edition of the MOCA Motion.




