
Remembrance



# Millican Ogden History Snippets From a Senior - Part 2

This month, we have the continuation of an article written by the grandson of George Moss, after whom George Moss Park is named. George and his wife, Edith, settled in Ogden in 1913 when he obtained a job as a machinist at the C.P.R. Ogden Shops. George was a member of St. Augustine's Church, was the secretary of the Ogden Community Association for 32 years, and was a Charter Member of the Ogden Legion. The park is named after him for his dedicated service to his community.

In the early 50's some of our garden became the home of a single car garage. At that time, my parents became the proud owners of a 1939 blue Chev that needed shelter. Dad took on the construction project with his usual vigour. He purchased used Box Car doors from the CPR. The doors were made of tongue and groove fir. There were about 30 doors if I recall. The only problem was, the boards on the doors were all securely nailed and each nail was bent over so they wouldn't shake loose while in transport on the rail line. Dad knew this but the doors only cost a dollar each so they could be used to build a pretty inexpensive garage. So, guess who got the job of using a hammer and cold chisel and straightening those nails. You guessed it, Dad and me!

Mentioning gardens reminds me of a Community garden that had been developed on the south facing slope of the hill between 18th street and 20th Street. It was a garden that was used to provide produce to the single men's hostel, the red brick building near the entrance to the CPR shops. I really don't know very much about this, but maybe some of you reading this could add information but if I recall, there was even a root cellar built into the side of the hill and used to store produce from the gardens.

Living in Ogden in the 1940's and early 50's, was like living in a small town. We were virtually isolated from the rest of the city of Calgary. Everyone knew everyone else. Most of the men in the community walked to work, my Dad included. The whistle to begin work blew at 8:00AM then again at noon and also at 4:00 pm. Many dirt trails were made across George Moss Park by the men walking to work.

Some days my sister and I would eagerly await the sound of the 4PM whistle. We would ask our Mom if we could meet our Dad who was walking home. He was always glad to see us and usually gave one of us the pleasure of carrying his metal lunch bucket and thermos home.

After work was over and supper was done people engaged in recreational activities. In the southeast of what is now George Moss Park, there were tennis courts and in the winter near the same location there was an outside skating rink. It had boards all around and had outdoor lighting. Mr. and Mrs Channel managed the rink. It had a building that everyone called "The Shack". The building was large enough to accommodate two hockey teams on benches built along three walls. There was a large pot-bellied wood burning stove in the middle of the room which Mr. Channel kept stoked with fire wood. As a Pee Wee player, I can still recall the smell of wintergreen as it was being applied to feet and hands that had experienced frostbite while out on the ice. Channel's also had a concession in the "Shack" where they sold hot dogs, pop, and other confectionary. After heavy snowfalls, the Community would get together to clean the ice surface. The men would man scrapers and push the snow to the side of the boards and then others would throw it over the boards with shovels. Sometimes the banks of snow would be higher than the boards. Almost every Saturday night was devoted to couples who wished to skate. The Channels had a record player and speaker and couples would skate the evening away. On a clear, starlight night, you could go into our yard and hear the strains of the Skaters Waltz coming through the cold night air.

Keith's reminiscences will be continued in the next edition of the MOCA Motion.
