Update from the Lynnwood Ogden Community Garden

It's always amazing how time flies past in the summer, we're nearing the final stretch of good growing days and produce is starting to come out of the gardens. While this season hasn't been the easiest for gardening, owing to a dry spring, wet summer, and the occasional catastrophic hail storm; it hasn't broken the spirit of Calgary's gardeners who are at home with adversity. In the community garden, we continued with our plans and finished the construction of additional raised beds and a shed - both of which were made possible through generous donations from the Lions Club and the Calgary Foundation. The perennial border which was planted last year has started to come into its own with the haskap and Saskatoon bushes putting on a solid display of growth.

As fall approaches, here are some things to keep in mind for your gardens whether on your property or at the community garden:

Harvest produce as it ripens. Towards the end of the year there is a trickle followed by a flood as all the produce begins to quickly ripen. It's important to harvest regularly to prevent spoilage, and give thought to how you want to use your harvest. Will you be eating it fresh, freezing it,

or preserving it?

Plan your fall plantings. While it's early to start any fall crops like onions or garlic, it isn't too early to start planning which

varieties you want to plant and where

you'd like to put them in your garden.

Replant empty spaces with fast maturing vegetables

As space in your garden opens up, you might have the opportunity to plant a second crop which matures quickly and can be harvested before the first frost.

Radishes and salad greens are typical choices, although be careful to cover them and water them frequently since they prefer cooler conditions.

Amend your gardens soil. Once the garden begins to empty out, it's a good time to consider if you want to add compost or other soil amendments to improve the health of the ground. There are a lot of options so do some research and see what fits with the needs of your garden._____

Wishing you a good harvest this year, and hopefully a long warm fall.

George Moss Park Redevelopment Update

Parks Foundation along with the YCC-Youths Centres of Calgary have been hard at work and are excited to share an update with the community of Millican Ogden on the progress of the redevelopment project in George Moss Park. The updated design retains the original concept and many of the features that were included in the first concept but has been refined to reflect existing site conditions, available budget, and feedback from the community, youths, and

various community interest groups. The current design still features one full-size basketball court, two half courts with games lines, a tot lot playground addition to accommodate younger age groups and plenty of seating and picnic tables for community residences and kids to enjoy. The revised design improves the integration of the park's existing amenities by also tying in the existing community rink area and the existing playground to the west with a linear pathway connection.

Thanks to the support of various donors and grantors, including the Alberta Government, the City of Calgary/Green Line, the Calgary Foundation, and several other donors, project fundraising efforts have allowed us to make this proposed design possible. The project has since undergone a review by the City and the project has been tendered and awarded for construction with anticipated plans to start construction next month. We are currently in the process of seeking an artist to install murals across the sport courts to create a beautiful and vibrant artistic space that everyone in the community can enjoy. Opportunities for permanent traffic calming measures along 74 Ave SE

are still being explored with the City and we hope that there will be an opportunity to implemented this in a future phase. An enhanced temporary crosswalk painting at the intersection is still being proposed to create enhanced visual cues for traffic and pedestrian crossing. Construction would be expected to occur over the summer and continue into early fall, weather permitting. Construction is anticipated to be complete in spring of 2024, when we also hope to be able to celebrate the opening of the space with the community.

When it Roars, Stay Indoors Calgary



Summer is a beautiful time of year to spend outside under the warm sun, but it's also Calgary's most active storm season. While storms can be mesmerizing and exciting, they can also be dangerous.

Calgary is prone to intense and sometimes dangerous summer storms. Keep yourself, your family and your property safe during a summer storm by signing up for emergency alerts and making an emergency plan suited for your family.

In addition, thunder, lightning, rain, and wind, summer storms often bring hail which can damage houses and cars and cause injuries. Protect your home and property by parking under shelter, secure items that might blow away, and removing weak branches and trees.

Public weather alerts for Alberta and Alberta Emergency Alerts let the public know when a strong storm is coming. A "severe weather watch" means the conditions favour a specific type of hazardous weather, and a "severe weather warning" means that the weather event will happen in the next 30 minutes.





During a storm, the best place to be is in an **enclosed building or** hard-topped vehicle. Stay away from high ground, isolated trees or telephone poles, picnic shelters, and open spaces to avoid being hit by lightning. Keep yourself and your pets inside until the storm has


