MOCA Community Clean-up of Saturday May 6th: MOCA extends its appreciation to the great number of volunteers who came out to assist with the annual clean-up and with the City of Calgary workers. Other than the long lines of vehicles waiting for the 9 am start time, the day unrolled with much ease. Moving forward, it is to be noted that the afternoon line-ups drastically decreased between noon and 1:45 pm. Having worked the MOCA Community Clean-up for over ten years, I was most impressed with the gratitude expressed by the users. ECCO Waste: A reminder that with a valid 2023/24 MOCA Membership, members can access ECCO Waste for one free load per month by showing a MOCA community membership card. The ECCO Waste website provides a list of acceptable waste and maximum monthly weight. MOCA Community Hall Capital Improvement: At the May MOCA General Meeting, it was announced that the Community Hall Capital Improvement is now moving forward as a renovation project as opposed to an expansion one. The first round of renovations will include accessible bathrooms in the upper and lower halls, including an additional bathroom, storage room space, and new floors in the upper hall. The work is dated for later this year with the dirt mounds in the rear of the building being removed in the upcoming season.





The Millican-Ogden Outdoor Swimming Pool: The outdoor pool will be opening for its summer season on June 17, 2023. As the outdoor pool is operated by the City of Calgary, information in regards to outdoor pool hours, swimming lessons or pool rentals, can be obtained by either contacting the pool at 403-221-3571 or by e-mail at millican@benchmarkprojects.com. Traffic Safety Project: After ongoing advocacy by community members and MOCA, the City of Calgary installed temporary calming curbs along 18 St SE and 66 Ave SE. These curbs not only shorten crossing distances for pedestrians, including the Banting & Best and the Sherwood schools students, but also serve to narrow the streets to slow down traffic. The unposted speed limit on most streets in our community is 40 km/h with a posted 30 km/h speed limit in playground and school zones between 7:30 am and 9:00 pm. JANE'S WALK

On the morning of Sunday, May 7th, Millican Ogden residents Bonny Warbeck and Bob Appleby hosted a Jane's Walk called "History of Millican Ogden".

Jane's Walk is a free walking tour event that takes place each May around the world to recognize famed urbanist Jane Jacobs. Community volunteers lead walks through their neighborhoods, highlighting interesting facts and stories.

Over 50 people joined Bonny and Bob on their guided tour through both Ogden and up through Millican Estates. Attendees were treated to well-researched details about significant buildings like the Ogden Hotel (now known as Victory Manor), the Ogden Block, St. Augustine's Church, and many others. Hearing the stories of some of the residents that have come and gone was riveting.

It is fascinating to imagine our community over 100 years ago, when Ogden was considered a separate town and before the numbered street names came in. Hopefully this walk can be conducted annually.





There is currently a bridge rehabilitation project on the Eastbound and Westbound Ogden Road SE Bridge (Bonnybrook Bridge) over the Bow River. The estimated timeline for this project is May 2nd to September 30th and may impact traffic in the community.

This project will extend the service life of the bridge and improve safety for drivers. Work to be done includes expansion joint replacement, expansion joint seal replacement, barrier repair, and other miscellaneous concrete repairs.

Construction will be completed in stages and anticipated traffic staging includes variable lane closures throughout the construction period. To minimize the traffic impact, work within the roadway is planned for nighttime and weekends and barrier repairs will mostly take place during the day.

Access to and across the bridge will be maintained throughout the project and

temporary walkways will be provided as required to route pedestrians around work areas during construction activities
