OCTOBER 2023 VICE PRESIDENT MESSAGE

October 17, 2023 MOCA Annual General Meeting:

As the MOCA hall renovations will not completed by October 17th, the AGM will be held at a short distance away from the hall in the parish hall of St Bernadette Church, 71O3 – 2OA Street SE. The AGM is an opportunity to hear the year in review of MOCA activities as well as take part in the elections of new Directors.



As per MOCA Bylaws, MOCA can have a maximum of 12 directors. Once elected, directors serve 2-year terms and can have their names put forward for re-election at the end of their second term as per the MOCA Bylaws.



Returning for year two of their term are the following 6 directors: Jim Logan, Angela Kruickshank, Corinne Watt, Barry Bickford and Sean Carney.



Up for re-election are Vice President Lorraine Robinson, Secretary Zev Klymocko and two 2022-2023 Director appointed directors Gary Sarohia and Skylar Loder * As per the MOCA Bylaws.



Should more than one nomination come from the floor, an election will be called. If not, a motion will be made for nominees to be voted in by acclamation. *To be nominated, a nominee must have purchased a MOCA membership 3O days prior to the AGM as per the MOCA Bylaws.

Calgary Policing Summit

The Calgary Police Commission hosted a one-day summit to get community input on policing on Friday, Sept. 8, 2023, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. As MOCA Vice President, I attended on behalf of the Association.

Shawn Cornett, Chair of Calgary Police Commission and Mark Neufeld, Chief Constable of the Calgary Police Service, opened the summit with an overview of what Calgary Policy Service (CPS) is doing with community partners to better help people in crisis. This was followed by an academic panel discussion on how changes in our community are impacting our expectations of policing.

The summit also included a message by Hon. Mike Ellis, Alberta Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Services, on how the Government of Alberta is supporting public safety in our city. Following his message, were words from Jyoti Gondek, Mayor of Calgary.

"See it; say it" was also a key message shared at the summit. If you see a crime, no matter how petty, taking place, you are encouraged to enter it online on the CPS Online Reporting site. As certain petty crimes can at times be traced back to one individual or more, online submissions better assist with the tracking. If you are unable to do an online submission, you can call 403.266.1234. As always, if an emergency is presenting itself requiring immediate police attention, please call 911.

Monthly Ogden Monthly Statistic Report: Starting in November, Constable Sue Bennett, the MOCA designated Police Resource Officer, will be providing us with a Monthly Ogden Statistic Report which will be added to the MOCA Motion Newsletters. Her plans are to attend the November 7th General Meeting to share this information and the reporting format.

The Mustard Seed Ogden Hub:29 Project (former Ogden United Church): The MOCA Directors were invited to tour Hub:29, located at 74O1 – 23 St SE, Calgary, last Monday, September 18th.

Hub:29 is the realization of a vision to build resilient families and communities. It is a collaborative effort to sustain the spirit of the community by investing in the future of families. When we help families thrive, the whole community thrives.

Hub:29 consists of 24 units (2 and 3 bedroom units/8 accessible) and will be operated by Mustard Seed. Applications for renters are presently being accepted with the goal of having residents move in at the beginning of November of this year. The planned daycare will open in January 2024 with access to a roof top playground. The Center will also have a Community Kitchen operated by Concorde Group and will also house a coffee shop. Zucchini Chocolate Chip Brownies

350° oven 9×13 pan
1 1/2 c granulated sugar
1/2 cups canola or vegetable oil
2 cups all purpose flour
1/4 cups unsweetened cocoa
2 cups shredded zucchini (don't squeeze moisture out)
2 tsp vanilla extract
1 tsp salt
1 1/2 tsp baking soda
1 1/4 cups Chocolate chips

Combine sugar, oil, flour until it resembles sand.

Add cocoa, zucchini, vanilla extract, salt, baking soda, and

1cup of chocolate chips.

Pour into pan and sprinkle with

remaining chocolate chips.

Bake 28-32 minutes or until toothpick comes clean.
