MOCA Hall Renovation Update:

- Renovations are moving forward a little slower than planned. Contractor and materials availability are contributing to the delay.
- Exterior work is moving forward with the removal of the old steps and ramp. New steps are slated to be installed in the next week or two. A new access ramp and outside gathering area is also planned. Necessary work for a development permit application to address redressing the exterior of the building is near completion.
- Interior work on the kitchen and bathroom areas continues to move along. The plumbing and electrical permits have been issued.
- The goal is to have the Upper Hall renovations finalized before the end of this year and the Lower Hall renovations shortly thereafter. Work on the MOCA office area will begin once the main hall is near completion.
- MOCA received a donation of \$10,000 from the Calgary Southridge Lions Club to be used toward the hall renovations.
- · When complete a plaque recognizing contributions from various parties will be placed in the facility.

The November General Meeting will be held in the parish hall of St. Bernadette Church located at 7103 – 20A Street SE. The Association extends its gratitude to the parish for accommodating MOCA with a meeting space during its renovations.

Jack Setters Hockey Skate and Helmet Giveaway:

SE CCRC (South East Calgary Resource Center):

Employment Assistance: Working in collaboration with the Calgary Economic Council (CEC), CEC is providing the SE CCRC with access to employment agencies and in return, the SE CCRC is helping CEC fill their short-term employment contracts. The SE CCRC is also working with the CEC on a policy paper examining and reporting on the difficulty for some men from 45-6O have in obtaining full time work.

Winter gear distribution is ongoing. As of Monday, October 16th, 2O23, winter wear items were distributed to clients. As it is expected that winter wear will continue to be in demand into the month of November, please consider donating gently used winter wear you are no longer wearing to the SE CCRC.

Green Line's Construction - 78th Ave SE Ogden:

Embankments for rail diversion tracks are presently being built. Once the trains are diverted, construction work will begin on the original embankments without disruption to the schedule of CPKC trains. Following completion of the 78 Avenue tunnel, the CPKC trains will be moved back to their original track and the vehicle crossing at 69 Avenue S.E., east of Ogden Road, will be permanently closed. OGDEN "Better Not Tell You Now" ARTWORK PROJECT

A temporary, engagement-focused public art project by Cassie Suche. Commissioned by the City of Calgary. Nestled between CP rail and The Bow, Millican Ogden is somewhat disconnected from the rest of Calgary. A shared sense of separateness among its residents has helped establish it as a tight-knit and exceptionally community-oriented place. The people of Millican Ogden are neighbourly and engaged, and have developed a strong collective support system in the neighbourhood.

Currently, the neighbourhood is undergoing a number of changes. The City is preparing for construction of the green line, which will strengthen the connection between Millican Ogden and the rest of Calgary. The increasing development is beginning to change the area in noticeable ways.

Residents have mixed feelings about these changes. There is a back-and-forth dialogue taking place about maintaining Millican Ogden's If You Know You Know quality, and embracing some of the benefits that could come with a stronger connection to the rest of Calgary.

The artist chose to use Magic 8balls to embody this idea. The toys reference indecision and future-telling with an element of playfulness that mirrors the community's spirit. Using resident's responses to open-ended prompts about Millican Ogden, a project with two connected pieces was created.

The first piece of the work is a set of three interactive magic 8balls which will be located at the Millican Ogden community centre. Each magic 8ball contains a series of messages and predictions from the residents. The second component of the work displays these messages again on aluminum signs mounted on 11 poles throughout the neighbourhood just off Ogden Road. The triangular signs continue the motif of the 8ball, organized into sets of four as impromptu poetry.

A walk-about tour of the signs will take place on Saturday, November 4th at 1 pm. Interested participants are invited to meet in front of the SE CCRC building located at 2734 – 76 Ave SE. The tour will end with a reception at the SE CCRC and the presentation of the three accompanying interactive magic 8balls.

Titled Better Not Tell You Now (a traditional, ambiguous 8ball response), the project highlights the notion that this mixed apprehension is fueled by a deep and resounding love of the neighbourhood. It aims to encapsulate some of Millican Ogden's character while expressing the community's collective inquiry for what comes next.



The panels will be painted on City-owned poles indicated by the green circles. The direction of the on text is indicated by the arrows.
